

North Branch Canal Cruise



The Susquehanna River stretches from Cooperstown, New York all the way to the Chesapeake Bay, Maryland; and along its nearly **450 miles** it has fueled the growth of settlements and cities for hundreds of years. Today the river continues to play a vital role in the lifestyles and economies of the towns along its banks.

The Susquehanna River travels directly through Columbia and Montour Counties and offers a wide array of canoeing, kayaking and fishing opportunities. For the first time, Canoe Susquehanna is offering an exciting new experience - the North Branch Canal Cruise. **We're exploring the Susquehanna River and the fascinating history of its River Towns as it passes through Columbia and Montour Counties.**

The trip schedule coordinates paddling with informative talks by local historians and experts in the traditional and modern uses of the river in this area, in order to provide enlightening observations and accounts of various points of interest along the way and to help us experience the transition from log rafts and coal barges to kayaks and triathlon races.

We continue down the river, with historical interpretation at several stops including a mill site and **canal aqueduct** as well as other canal era features along the river. As we gain an appreciation for the canals' unique contribution to the area's past, we learn about its potential to enhance the counties' future.

This trip is open to the public and is suitable for almost anyone. We'll enjoy a day of
